After releasing my 2008 debut album "My Introduction", I had a desire to create more music that

dealt with lyrics. Utilizing the ever growing live music scene here in the jersey shore area, my inspiration to write, and refine my songwriting never waned. The continued support of friends and fellow musicians helped me to better understand and appreciate the larger musical picture.

Since my debut release, it has been a very unusual creative journey writing and producing the songs that I have just started to release beginning with "Where do we go from here". Music can be very personal, and my trials and tribulations of being human in an ever changing state of passion, love, disappointment and pain only helps to channel those emotions.

When writing, recording and performing there can be no walls, no labels, no barriers between the artist and the audience. Music is the conduit, and I will always strive to adhere to that principle.



With the release of "Where do we go from here", my desire is to begin a quest of releasing minialbums of my work so you can feel what I feel, and maybe see through my musical eye, the colors of life as I have experienced.

Utilizing my small boutique setup, recording "Where do we go from here" required me to wear the many hats of songwriter, recording engineer, producer, and even the arch enemy of myself. The setup was nothing too elaborate, a small guitar amplifier in a closet, a variety of microphones, Protools on a mac with a modest collection of plugins for dynamics and processing, a single pair of KRK monitors, guitar pedals and an external preamp. Striving to get the best from what you have is a never ending process.



Originally I was striving to release a full album of 11 or 12 tracks. I soon could see that for me, the process was like two steps forward, one step back. To keep my eye on the eight ball knowing that I had that many songs to produce, it became a daunting task and soon my creative "mojo" was beginning to wane. Then one day I came upon an article that changed my perspective. In a world so connected by the internet, the concept of the full album of days ago, seemed out-of-step. I was questioning the relevance of a full album in the age of digital downloads and streaming singles.

From this rude awakening, my strategy has evolved to my release of mini-albums in digital format, each with a relevant theme or emotion. Maybe I have found a compromise of the old versus the new.
